11:30 - 14:00 Transnational Filmmaking

One of the missions of the HER Docs Foundation is to support women documentary filmmakers who have been forced or have decided to leave their place of residence. Last year's edition of the HER Docs Forum became a platform for the exchange of ideas and networking for women documentary filmmakers from Central and Eastern Europe, especially from Ukraine and Belarus, who are professionally active in Poland. As part of the continuation of this transnational cooperation, we invite you to a think tank meeting this year.
